

North Tarrant Express 35W Segment 3C Alliance Connector

The North Tarrant Express (NTE) 35W 3C project is the culmination of 10 years of progress and growth in Tarrant County. This more than \$1 billion project has transformed 6.7 miles of Interstate 35W between North Tarrant Parkway and Eagle Parkway.

The project includes:

- Reconstructed main highway lanes
- Expanded frontage roads
- Addition of two managed lanes in each direction

Connecting downtown Fort Worth and the Alliance development into Denton County, this segment helps create a safer, faster and more reliable movement of people, goods and services.
